


Sweet Sixteen



This one was debuted on Monk Turner's myspace page prior to the release of "Calendar" and it completely caught me off guard. Everything I had heard from him prior to this had been more on the acoustic side. This seemed to come from left-field. A Hip-Hop club banger from Monk Turner? You damn straight. This is a jam that you'll find yourself bumping over and over. A banger to be cranked in your Jeep. Some of that ill ish for waking your neighbors.

Monk Turner

Monk Turner does not write songs. He writes albums. If you only listen to a song or two, you're missing the point.

Monk began his music career in the early 1990s as a principal songwriter for several groups. It was during this Dark Age that "The Hit Single" phenomenon began to decimate popular music.

Having his own soul saved by rock 'n' roll (think Pink Floyd's 'The Wall', The Who's 'Tommy' and Rush's '2112') Monk has dedicated his life to becoming a galactic defender of the Concept Album.

5 For Insight

01 - Why free music? People still buy music?

02 - What concept album originally inspired you to think that maybe you'd like to record concept albums of your own? Some of my first exposure to music was through concept records. The Wall, Rush's 2112, Dark Side of the Moon, and of course the album that changed my life was The Who's Tommy.

03 - Aside from the concept album influence, who else (in popular culture or otherwise) influenced your music? I think the question is what hasn't influenced my music. I have a grip of respect for Elvis Costello with his ability to guide his own career with no regard for genre or what box a record label tries to put him in. Musically I'm influenced by everything. I'm influenced by the collective of musicians on my concept albums. I'll write a song for a specific artist because I like what they do on one of their own songs. I'm influenced by current events. I'm influenced by visual art, by what's on the radio and what's not on the radio, what the kids are listening to, what the folks in retirement homes are listening to. The LA music scene... the good one that is. I could go on...

Q4 - What was the last free netaudio album you downloaded and listened to? I recently did a Creative Commons Salon with Curt Smith of Tear for Fears fame. His latest solo record is CC licensed (<http://www.curtsmithofficial.com/music/album/halfway-please/>). The first track is the joint.

Q5 - Catsup, Ketchup or Mustard? I tend to use BBQ sauce more than I use catsup. I think it comes from when I used to live in Texas. Mean Mister Mustard sleeps in the park.

When She Looked At Me (I Saw Her Wondering)

A smooth hip-hop instrumental that literally drips with soulfulness with the help of a terrific soul-clap and a healthy dose of sampled strings. I'm quite literally salivating for a full-length release from niwa. His production skills are impeccable.

niwa

In an age where internet and MP3 didn't exist yet, niwa discovered a form of music-making on the PC called 'tracking'. Although the process was heavily limited (4 channels max, 31 samples max, 64kb per sample max), the 12 year old boy jumped at it with enthusiasm. Through modem-based Bulletin Board System he came in contact with the PC Demo Scene, where he served several music groups over a period of 10 years making mainly dance music

Puberty arose and so did the exploration of musical styles. Even though he came from a background which was heavily influenced by rock & roll and folk music, he set his own taste after listening to Isaac Hayes - That Loving Feeling. This revelation lead him to dig deeper into old soul and funk music. After that it was only a quick jump to a more contemporary style that, for him, supplied the same feeling: Hip Hop. Living in a country-side city didn't really offer a lot of chances to produce Hip Hop music, and so niwa set out to the more instrumental side of the music. Because he wasn't really gifted lyrical-wise, the blend of beats with melancholic samples on it was the ideal way for expressing his feelings.

After a couple of years of producing mainly for his own emotional fulfillment, he set out seeking MC's and DJ's. This resulted in several small-town hip-hop collaborations, which didn't really get off the ground, but were and excellent playground to explore the art of beat-creating on. Even though most projects only lasted a while, 1 project evolved into a full-fledged collaboration of beatcreators, MC's, DJ's and singers: Next Item

In the early months of 2007 niwa decided to shift his focus back on personal projects, and left Next Item to pursue his passion for downtempo once more. Currently he's getting ready to release some tracks for free, doing production on mixtapes and venturing into remixing tracks for friends.

5 For Insight

01 - Why free music? Because music is there to be listened to, one way or another. In a way, music is a common good and if I can make people happy by giving away some tracks for free, I'll be glad to do it.

02 - When can us niwa junkies expect a proper release? When they spread the word and people with money start noticing me, or when I get off my lazy ass and do some real politician' myself ;)

03 - During the days of tracking, which demo scene music groups did you release with? Is any of that output still available online? I've released for several small groups, and it's mostly crappy dance. The only notable release was for my friend Erik Skodvin from Miasmah.

04 - What was the last free netaudio album you downloaded and listened to? I check out netlabels a lot but I haven't found one yet that puts out music I _really_ dig. So I'd have to go way back to 2005 and say Comfort Fit "Forget & Remember" (<http://www.comfortfit.de/forget-and-remember-lp/>). That's an all-time classic right there.

05 - U.I.F.O., Above The Law or Braintax? Braintax. I'm a mid-end 90s man when it comes to beats (get those cheesy drum-machines out of my sight!), and I love the way Tax creates an unrealistic atmosphere in his stories.

Got his Marketing Degree title in Universidad de Palermo ('97 - '00). Got his Music Degree Title in ITMC (Instituto Tecnológico de Música Contemporánea) ('01-'03). He studied with Eduardo Casalla ('04), Arrangements & Composition with Juan Carlos Cirigliano (since '06). In 2003 traveled to New York, got classes with John Riley, Peter Retzlaff and Ian Froman. During 2004 he participates in XXII Curitiba's Music Workshop in Brazil. At that time, he studied with Nenê, Robertinho Silva and got group practice lessons with Mauro Senise and Paulo Russo. During 2005 he traveled to La Habana, Cuba and studied with Enrique Plá, Yaroldy Abreu, Ramsés Rodríguez and Emilio del Monte Jr. On 2008's summer he traveled to Montevideo, Uruguay and got classes with Jose Luis Perez, Juan Carlos Ferreira and "Tatita" Marquez. With Sebastián Zannetto, they performed at Festival Internacional Jazz Plaza 2005 in La Habana, Cuba. In Buenos Aires, Festival de Música por la Identidad in 2004 organized by Madres de Plaza de Mayo. With Ruben Ferrero, they presented his record "Luz Cardinal" in most of Buenos Aires jazz stages, and share presentations with Alejandro Demogli and Pablo Ledesma among others. With Pablo Satek, they performed at Festival de Jazz de Buenos Aires 2003 and Primer Encuentro de Jazz Independiente in 2005.

5 For Insight

01 - Why free music? There are two reasons, the first one, is about love, and it has to do with a personal need to share and tell everyone what i do and know how other persons feel about my music, and the opposite, to know what other composers feel about music and how they express themselves...

The second reason, it's about the world and industry, because during the late 50 years, technology advanced in order to develop the media, and the record industry or labels, didn't make the same evolution and progress, they were forced to change the support, from cassettes to cds or dvds, nowadays mp3... so now i think we have to look at the beginning when all that matters was the disc, physically, and the music, that's why i release my album in a handmade wooden box and the music is free to download, because, who wants the music, can hear it as soon as could and who wants the physical disc, has to order it.

02 - Growing up, what forms of Jazz influenced you most?

03 - Which music artists outside the world of Jazz influenced you most? North-American Jazz is one of a million expressions that came out cause the history of the continent, it's only one expression, it has to do to an harmonic development, improvisation techniques and concepts, european instruments, blablaba geografically i live in a city that has a folcloric music, tango, that doesn't use any percussion in his traditional instrument set up, cause of the story...if i travel a few miles around i will find, at least 5 different musical languages.

Directly answering your question, I breath american music, from Alaska to Argentina, and i'm very influenced by music from USA, Cuba, Brasil, Uruguay and Argentina, of course.

Some names (they came up without thinking...), Bill Evans, Arsenio Rodriguez, Bebo & Chucho Valdes, Ramses Rodriguez, Egberto Gismonti, Nene, Joao Gilberto, Ruben Rada, Astor Piazzolla, Gustavo "Cuchi" Leguizamon, and there are at least a hundred artists more that thrills me...

This track along with others on his "So Rhythmic" release prove that Elias is expert at creating a completely modern electro-funk that uses classic synths, vocoders and the 80s as a jump-off point. Hi-NRG boyeeeeeeeeeeee!

Elias Damian

Imagine a weird cook who sliced some fresh meat to put it back together to create a whole new dish. Then he would lay it on some dirty old french fries and shower it with a thick hot sauce. Sounds disgusting but tastes twice as good! This cook is called Elias Damian, an electro musician hailing from Cologne, Germany. Focused on all kinds of synthesized vocals, he combines the drive of european electro music with the organic grooves of electro funk and jazz of the early 80s. Some classic synthesizers, a vocoder, a Fender Rhodes piano and a microphone are the basis on which he realizes his vision of a retro-futuristic sound, dirty and funky electronic dance music.

Born and raised in a half Greek and half Arab family, Elias early got infected by the most rhythmic oriental music. Germany, being a dominant hatchery for electronic music embossed his musical taste already as a child. Additionally there was no way around loving the music of Michael Jackson when you grow up in the 80s. So, these three factors paved his way to being a hopeless manic music freak. The result was a strange young man that loved to play his favourite R&B and hip hop records at birthday parties and later at the hottest clubs around Cologne City, known as DJ Atomik-E. After he started remixing and recording his own music he soon won the clubbangaz worldwide remix contest! More releases followed. But he felt too constricted by the bonds of hip hop music. So he began experimenting with all kinds of musical styles and especially with vocal samples and funky old synthesizers. He took house music, electro, disco, oriental music, anything that - in fact - GROOVES!

And now, there you got it! Elias Damian, the weird cook of new electro funk!

5 For Insight

01 - Why free music? I think that each and every artist who spends hours and days on his creative work, sooner or later wants to present that work to people. Of course I'm making music for myself, there's nothing that I'd rather do... it's a passion. I just can't live without music. I put everything in it, all my heart, my money and my time. Though, at the end of the day I want my music to be heard. I want millions of people to listen to it. I don't care if I get paid for it or not. if I

know that someone on the other side of the globe listens to my stuff and starts nodding their head, I'm extremely happy! The internet makes it possible to reach people in each and every country. That's a beautiful thing!

02 - Reading your bio, it's quite apparent that rhythmic, funky music is in your blood. My question is this... what influences did you get from the Rock world, if any? When I grew up, many of my friends were into grunge, metal and crossover. They used to listen to Rage Against the Machine, The Judgement Day soundtrack, Body Count, Nirvana, Guns 'N Roses and of course Metallica. I started appreciating that kind of music more and more. I think that Metallica's "Nothing Else Matters" is one of the greatest songs EVER! Though, my all-time favorite has gotta be the Red Hot Chili Peppers. They're probably the best band on earth!



The Harvey Girls

Melissa Rodenbeek and Hiram Luche formed The Harvey Girls in August of 2003 in Lawrence, Kansas. The group, named after the waitresses who served travelers in the American West from the late 19th to the mid 20th centuries along the AT&SF railways, combine the melodies of bubblegum pop with experimentation in sound. Their music stands as a cross between Prince Paul's production work and the songs of the Shangri-Las (that's what we're sticking with; feel free to come up with your own description).

The Harvey Girls are a group that can argue about the merits of a much-needed editor for David Foster Wallace (or anyone who uses three damn names for that matter), claim that ABBA is the greatest pop group of all time without an ironic smirk, and bake you a decent cake for your birthday. If you would like a list of our favorite acronyms, to know what we have been reading lately, or to let us know what day your birthday falls on, you can just drop us a line.

5 For Insight

01 - Why free music? The sense of entitlement that pervades everything on the internet led us to cut it off at the pass. This did allow for those without the economic means to buy our music to find most of our earlier stuff for free. This is good in the US since there are a) 257 new bands a day and b) a government that has effectively steered the ship into the shore while laughing, causing the economy to turn to shit for everyone not involved in the steering of the ship.

02 - What influenced your musical taste most... radio, tv, film or literature? All of that, actually. We both listened to a lot of music as kids because our parents loved music. Also, Hiram used to have really horrible ear problems as a kid. 

This is some on that other level ish. Completely modern, yet amazingly retro all at once... bits of the psychedelic 60s can be heard floating around. Everything from the fresh Bono-esque vocals to the instrumentation has such a cool vibe. I predict that this just may become a lifelong favorite of at least one of you.

The Gr00ming

The Gr00ming are an eclectic and test driver duet born from the interaction between an artist linked to the poetry of the lyrics (P) and an electro-minimal DJ (Giachxx). 02 - Do you have anything new in the works? As always, more than one thing, actually :-)




